

EASTERN REGIONAL FFA CREED SPEAKING CAREER DEVELOPMENT EVENT

Important Note: Please thoroughly read the Introduction Section at the beginning of this Bulletin for complete rules and procedures, which are relevant to all Big E FFA Development Events.

EVENT RULES

1. The Big E FFA Creed Speaking Career Development will be limited to one participant per state who must have been enrolled in Grades 7, 8, or 9 at the time of selection by the state for this event.
2. Official FFA dress is required for this event.
3. The Big E FFA Creed Speaking Career Development will follow the general rules and policies for all Big E FFA Career Development Events.
4. The Big E FFA Creed Speaking Superintendent will be in charge of this event.
5. Three to six competent and impartial persons will be selected to judge the event. At least one of the judges should have an agricultural/FFA background.

EVENT FORMAT

1. The event will include both an oral presentation and questioning period. The questions will be directly related to the FFA Creed. Each contestant will be asked three questions per round, with a five minute total time limit. The questions will be formulated annually by the Big E Creed Speaking Superintendent. Sample questions will not be available before the event.
2. Participants will recite the FFA Creed from the current year's Official FFA Manual.
3. The event will be a timed activity with four (4) minutes for presentation. After four minutes one (1) point will be deducted for every second over the time limit.
4. The event Superintendents will randomly determine the speaking order. The program chairperson shall introduce each participant by contestant number and in the order of the drawing. No props are to be used. Applause shall be withheld until all participants have spoken. The audience will be advised to turn off all electronic devices. No photography is allowed during the event.
5. Each contestant must recite the FFA Creed from memory. Each contestant shall begin the presentation by stating "The FFA Creed by E.M. Tiffany". Each contestant shall end the presentation with the statement "... that inspiring task. Thank you."
6. Contestants will be held in isolation until their presentation. Contestants will not be allowed to have contact with any outside person during this time. Once the contestant has completed their presentation they are allowed to view the remaining presentations.
7. At the time of the event, the judges will be seated in different sections of the room in which the event is held. They will score each participant on the delivery of the FFA Creed using the score sheet provided.
8. A time keeper shall be designated who will record the time used by each participant in delivering the Creed.
9. A contest accuracy judge will record the number of recitation errors made during delivery.
10. When participants have finished speaking, each judge will total the score for each speaker. The timekeeper and accuracy judges' records will be used in computing the final score for each participant. The judges' score sheets will then be submitted to the event Superintendent to determine the final rating of participants.

TIEBREAKERS

Ties will be broken based on the greatest number of low ranks. Participant's low ranks will be counted and the participant with the greatest number of low ranks will be declared the winner. If a tie still exists then the event superintendents will rank the participant's response to questions. The participant with the greatest number of low ranks from the response to questions will be declared the winner. If a tie still exists then the participant's raw scores will be totaled. The participant with the greatest total of raw scores will be described the winner.
