SPECIAL RULES

1. READ GENERAL RULES. All entries and awards within this show will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations published in this Premium Book and the following Special Rules.

2. WEIGH-OFF. Entries for each weigh-off must arrive between 5-5:45pm. The weigh-off will start at 6:30pm. Late entries will not be accepted. Each exhibitor must have sent in an entry form with a \$5 entry fee per vegetable by August 31. We will not accept vegetables that we do not have entry forms for. Pumpkins must be 80% orange. Any vegetable with less orange will be considered a squash. Committee decision is final.

3. PASSES. Three people passes and one auto pass will be issued per farm entering in the giant pumpkin and squash classes. 1 people pass and 1 auto pass will be given to the gourd, traditional and decorated pumpkin classes.

4. LOGISTICS. The top three to five in each class will be moved to Farm-A-Rama after the judging depending on availability of space. **Any entry not moved to Farm-A-Rama must be removed from the Mallary Complex immediately following judging.** The Youth Giant Pumpkins, Youth Giant Squash, Youth Traditional Pumpkin moved to Farm-A-Rama September 16, must stay on display in Farm-A-Rama until 10pm September 22. These vegetables will then be placed outside of the Agriculture Office Friday morning so the exhibit will be ready to accept the Adult pumpkins Friday evening, and should be picked up Friday evening, September 23. Entries may be picked up after 10pm September 22 or Friday evening prior to adult contest. Adult Giant Pumpkins, Adult Giant Squash moved

to the Farm-A-Rama Building on September 23 must stay on display until 10pm October 2. Arrangements must be made with the Farm-A-Rama Office regarding removal of the pumpkins. If arrangements are not made the pumpkins will be disposed of by Exposition personnel. **Youth Decorated Pumpkins** must be dropped off at Farm-A-Rama **September 15 by 8pm and must remain until 9pm September 22. Adult Decorated Pumpkins** must be dropped off at Farm-A-Rama **September 23 by 8pm and must remain until October 2.** Both classes will be judged after the weigh-offs are complete late Friday or early Saturday morning. We will provide a forklift to move & transport Giant Pumpkins & Giant Squash on day of weigh-off. **If forklift is needed to remove vegetables after display an appointment must be made by calling (413)205-5011 and asking for the Farm-A-Rama office. Gourds need to be delivered directly to the Farm-A-Rama office.**

5. GOURD COMPETITION LOGISTICS. Gourd entry fee will be \$2 per gourd. Show Management shall have the right to remove from exhibition at any time, any exhibit, or part thereof which is unsightly. Stems should remain on fresh and dried gourds. Stems are optional on crafted gourds.

AWARDS

OUTSTANDING YOUTH GROWER

ENTRIES WILL BE SPLIT AT THE TIME OF ARRIVAL INTO A JUNIOR AND SENIOR DIVISION.

Each youth entering a pumpkin or squash in the weigh-off must be present to participate in a short interview beginning at 5:30pm. Youth who do not participate in this process will forfeit the placing of their pumpkin or squash.

\$250 Jackpot will be awarded by **EASTERN STATES EXPOSITION** to the grower who beats the current weight record by the largest margin. In 2008, a record of 1284 lbs. was set by Richard Skrzypczak, Barre, Massachusetts.
