SPECIAL RULES

1. READ GENERAL RULES. All entries and awards within this show will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations published in this Premium Book and the following Special Rules.

2. ENTRY PROCESS. Entries may be made on The Big E website, www.TheBigE.com or by printing the entry form and mailing it in. Entry forms with payment should be sent to Agriculture & Education Department, Eastern States Exposition, 1305 Memorial Avenue, West Springfield MA 01089. Entry deadline is August 15, with late entries until August 31. Entry process is not complete until payment is received.

3. SANCTION. This Llama show is sanctioned by ILR and all rules and guidelines for this show will be in accordance with the ILR Show Division. For complete information and ILR Show Guidelines please see www.llamaregistry.com, Show Division information, then forms and documents, then Guidelines 1.1 under General. All llamas must be identified by microchip and all llamas, except youth listed llamas, must be registered. It is not necessary to be a member of the ILR Show Division to participate in this show. However, membership is necessary to receive points for your placings. 4. IDENTIFICATION. All camelids must be identified by microchip. The microchip number must match the health papers presented to inspectors for admission to the facility. Tattoo or photo ID is not acceptable! Camelids not complying will not be allowed off the trailer. **The exhibitor is responsible for providing or having available the appropriate readers.**

- 5. AGE RESTRICTION.** All llamas must be at least 5 months old. Nursing crias may not accompany dams into show ring.
- 6. GROUP ENTRIES.** An entry fee is not required for group classes but each animal must be entered and shown in an individual halter class.
- 7. REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE.** Original registration/listing certificate must be presented to the Show Clerk, Jan Brown, upon arrival on September 26. Using the ILR Show Module allows us to access the most current information on each entry, so certificate copies need not be sent with entries. Registration name and number must be clear and legible.
- 8. LLAMA REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS.** All llamas must be registered or have passed screening with the International Llama Registry [ILR] (see exception for youth division). Original registration must be presented at the show upon check-in. Entries without the certificates will not be accepted. Only a fax from the ILR office will be accepted instead of the original certificate at check-in.
- 9. ANIMAL CARE.** Feed, bedding and care of the animals is the sole responsibility of the owner or exhibitor. Pens must be bedded. No paper products will be allowed for bedding purposes. Eastern States Exposition provides one (1) bale of straw for each pen entered, to be used under mats or rubber flooring, by itself or over shavings.
- 10. SUBSTITUTIONS.** Substitutions will be allowed only until September 15 to allow for an accurate show book. This applies to llamas in classes where the entry is made in the name of the llama (halter and performance classes) and to handlers where the entry is made in the name of the handler (youth and showmanship).
- 11. YOUTH DIVISIONS.** All ages are as of January 1, 2011. All points go to the youth and not the llama. Divisions are as follows: Junior - 7-11 years; Intermediate - 12-15 years; and, Senior - 16-18 years. Exception: 7-year-old Juniors must have turned 7 AS OF SHOWDAY. Animal must be named on entry form. A llama may show in youth or open performance classes, but not both. **Listed llamas may be used by youth in Youth Performance, Costume, Llama Lead Line and Jackpot Obstacle.** (Youth may share a llama) In Youth performance classes, 3 refusals will be allowed. Two youth may share a llama, but must be in different showmanship divisions.
7-year-old youth may choose to show as Sub-Juniors or as Juniors.
- 12. SUB-JUNIOR YOUTH.** Showmanship, PR and Obstacle classes will be offered for our youngest exhibitors, age 3-7. These classes will not be placed and each contestant will receive a ribbon and small prize. For safety, an adult will be present with the child in the ring and offer whatever assistance is appropriate to the child. Premiums will not be paid for these classes.
- 13. CHAMPIONS.** Champion will be selected from the first place animals in each age division. Reserve Champion will be selected from the remaining first place animals, and the second place animal from the Grand Champion's age division. All animals will be placed and receive points according to ILR guidelines.
- 14. OVERALL CHAMPIONS (BEST IN SHOW).** Grand Champion in each age and sex division will compete for the title of Best In Show Male, Female and Non-Breeder.
- 15. PEN PANELS.** Pen panels are provided by Eastern States Exposition. Your cooperation is appreciated in moving the panels to the outside wall when leaving (see release times), to facilitate barn cleaning.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

FLEECE SHOW. The Big E Fleece Show is open to all and is not sanctioned. Llama fleeces must be received by September 12 and will be released back to you on Thursday, September 29. This fleece show is separate from the Fiber Nook classes (please see Fiber Section). You are encouraged to enter the Fiber Nook classes with your articles, which will be displayed for the duration of the Fair and show fairgoers the varied fibers produced by our animals. Entry fee is \$20 per fleece. Each exhibitor will receive written evaluation of fleece. Please see www.llamaregistry.com for guidelines and scorecard for fleeces. Fleeces may be delivered in person through 8pm September 12. Fleeces submitted by mail or UPS, must arrive by September 12. All fleece entries must include a photo of the animal and copy of registration certificate. Please write animal's name on the back of the photo and include phone number on the bag containing the fleece. Send fleeces to: Agriculture Department, Eastern States Exposition, 1305 Memorial Avenue, W. Springfield MA 01089. If you are planning to ship your items to the Exposition, please include a prepaid shipping label for return. Mailed items, not collected by you, will be sent by the end of the week following the Exposition.

Fleeces will be displayed in secure boxes throughout the Fair and may be offered for sale if you wish. A handling fee of 10% for selling fleeces will be charged. The income from this will support the Llama youth program at Eastern States Exposition. Fleeces, unless sold after judging, must remain on display until released on September 29.

ESE JACKPOT OBSTACLE COMPETITION. Entry fee: \$25 for Novice Jackpot; \$50 for Master Jackpot. Awards will be paid out according to number of entries. The primary goals of the Jackpot Obstacle Competition are to promote llamas in a positive manner to the general public, help create a viable venue for well-trained animals to earn income, thereby increasing their overall value, and to offer opportunities for llama owners to get together for an enjoyable activity. This course will strive to simulate natural, challenging conditions and obstacles that may be found on trails. The handler and llama should work as a team throughout the course.

HALTER CLASSES. All animals should be presented for judging with a halter and lead rope and no additional decorations. No ranch names or animal names should be displayed on the exhibitor during the class. Llamas may not be moved from one class to another after halter judging has begun, except at the judge's discretion.

SHOWMANSHIP. These classes will demonstrate the exhibitor's ability to prepare and present the llama to the judge in a halter class. Adult Advanced Showmanship is open to exhibitors who have shown for 4 or more years. Novice Showmanship is for adults with 1-3 years of llama showing experience.

COSTUME. Llamas are judged on willingness to accept costume and must be able to move in it freely. The judge will also be looking for originality, training, time and energy involved. Costume must not have been used at a previous Big E Llama Show.

YOUTH JUDGING PROGRAM. Junior, Intermediate and Senior Youth will judge one halter class, one performance class and one showmanship class. These classes are designed to give the youth experience in evaluating llama conformation, showmanship and obstacle performance. The Reasons Presentations encourage the Senior & Intermediate youth to organize their thoughts and practice speaking skills while critiquing a halter class. The Llama general knowledge quiz will test the llama knowledge of the Junior contestants. Please make entry on an official entry form. There is no additional entry fee for this program and a youth does not need a llama at the show to participate. Youth Judging will take place during the show on Tuesday and Wednesday. Senior youth may be asked to use the microphone for their oral reasons.

FLEECE DIVISIONS FOR HALTER. There are new divisions for halter this year: Suri, Classic / Light, Medium and Heavy. Shorn Llamas MUST be shown in the fleece division in which they would have been shown before shearing.

The ILR website has the complete description and photos on page 86 and following in the complete Show Division Guidelines. Please see http://www.lamaregistry.com/Forms/SD_Forms/ILR-SD_GN010_Guidelines_2.0.3.pdf for descriptions and photos of the various fleece divisions.

NON-BREEDER HALTER CLASSES. These classes are for gelded or vasectomized males, and spayed or non-reproductive females that are suitable for other purposes. These llamas must be registered. The registration or veterinary certificate must verify the non-reproductive condition. We will have 2 divisions for non-breeders, "working" and "fleece". "**Working Non-breeders**" shall be llamas that meet the requirements of the published fleece criteria for Classic or Classic/Light fleece on animals plus they shall have a phenotype suitable for athletic activities. "**Fleece Non-breeders**" shall be llamas that meet the requirements of the published fleece criteria for Suri, Silky, Medium or Heavy fleece.

GET-OF-SIRE. Each entry must include three offspring of either sex by the same sire. All get must be shown in their appropriate halter class age division. Get must represent offspring out of at least two different dams. The sire is not shown in this class. The entry is made in

the name of the sire. The get may be decided after halter classes but must be listed with the clerk before class is held. There is no additional fee for this class as the offspring have already been entered in their individual classes. If the exhibitor is not the sire's owner, the exhibitor must have written permission from the sire's owner and the entry is made in the owner's name.

PRODUCE OF DAM. Each entry must include two offspring of either sex, out of the same dam. All produce must be shown in their appropriate halter class age division. Dam is not present in this class. Entry is made in the name of the dam. Produce may be decided after halter classes, but must be listed with the clerk before class is held. There is no additional fee for this class as the offspring have already been entered in their individual classes. If the exhibitor is not the dam's owner, the exhibitor must have written permission from the dam's owner and the entry is made in the owner's name.

BRED AND OWNED. The highest placing animal in each male and female halter class, which was bred by the current owner, may return to be judged for these awards. Do not enter this class on entry form.

PERFORMANCE CLASSES. Llama entries in performance classes are restricted, in that a llama may be entered in youth or non-youth, but not both. Advanced Division: Open to all entries that have accumulated 35 points in ILR or ALSA performance classes. Novice Division: Open to all entries that have fewer than 35 points in ILR or ALSA performance classes.

PR/COMPANION CLASSES. This class is for the llama that participates in community activities, goes to schools, hospitals, service clubs and parades. The course will include obstacles of a type that may be encountered during interactions with public. There will be a "walk through" of the course before the class. There will be no preliminary judging this year.

FREESTYLE-OBSTACLE CLASSES. The purpose of the obstacle class is to demonstrate the well-trained llama's obedience and willingness to go where its handler asks it to go. The course will include several obstacles. There will be a "walk through" of the course before the class. There will be no preliminary judging this year.

TRAIL/PACK CLASSES. All tasks/obstacles will simulate what handler and llama might encounter or need to negotiate while hiking and/or packing on trails. The llama's maneuverability and manageability are being measured, not endurance, thus there are no weight requirements. Panniers must be filled out. All packs must have two cinches.

YOUTH SHOWCASE. Entries will include a poster with drawings or photographs and an educational message. For 2011, please tell about performance criteria, how to do performance or halter, or the differences between halter and performance judging. The visual display will be hung on the Fiber Nook for the public to enjoy. There is no entry fee, but please indicate intent to participate on entry form. Please be sure youth is named on the entry form and mail or hand deliver all posters to Eastern States Exposition by September 13. The youth's name may be on the front or back of the poster, but please be sure it is included. This class is intended to promote the breed and is not judged. Each entrant will be recognized with a rosette and a memento of the Fair. Posters will remain on display until Thursday morning, when the youth and llamas will enter the ring all together for recognition, and the announcer will summarize the project for the crowd. Excerpts from some posters may be read.

OBSTACLE DRIVING - SINGLE HITCH. The object of the Obstacle Driving Class is to demonstrate the llama's training, the driver's skill and the coordination of driver and llama. The turnout is to be judged on smoothness and accuracy of execution. The types of obstacles should reflect the types of problems the llama and driver may encounter when they are out on a pleasure excursion and maneuvering around the farm.

OPEN PLEASURE DRIVING. Single or double hitch allowed. Each llama in a double hitch receives points toward Performance Champion. The object of the pleasure driving class is to show the suitability of the llamas to provide a pleasant drive.

LLAMA LEAD LINE. This class promotes the practicality, versatility and elegance of llama fiber to

the public. For 2011, we are showcasing shawls and vests to encourage greater participation. Items shown previously at Eastern States Exposition are not eligible to be judged again. Naturally, complete outfits are always welcome too.

Youth (18 years and under)

Adult (19 and older)

THE OUTFIT: Each contestant must be fashionably dressed in a shawl or vest that is made of at least 50% llama fiber (blends with other natural fiber may be used). The garment must be made by the exhibitor, with assistance given to youth as needed.

THE LLAMA: The llama will be in halter, well-groomed and trained. It must be owned/leased by the exhibitor, and the majority of preparation for the showing (grooming and training) should have been done by the exhibitor. The llama and exhibitor should complement each other.

EXHIBITOR: The exhibitors should display the outfit and show their llama in a positive, poised manner.

SCORING:

Exhibitor: Poise and appearance30 pts.
 Shawl/Vest/Garment: Fit and construction40 pts.
 Llama: Appearance, grooming, management.....30 pts.
 Narrative on entry form is legible (**BONUS**)..... 5 pts.

FLEECE ON LLAMA. An open Walking Fleece/Fleece on Llama Class for learning purposes only, with no premiums. Tami Lash will evaluate fleeces on the llama on Thursday morning. Please enter this class on the entry form. Participants will be given the scorecard. The judge evaluates each llama's fleece and discusses it with the owner while filling out a scorecard. PREMIER BREEDER. This award is presented to the breeder who accumulates the highest points based on the animals shown which were bred by him/her. Halter classes only. Does not include group classes.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR. This award is presented to the exhibitor who accumulates the highest points based on the top six animals shown by him/her. Halter classes only. Does not include group classes.

HERDSMANSHIP AWARD. EASTERN STATES EXPOSITION presents an award to one llama herdsman who is voted by the exhibitors to best represent qualities of a good herdsman: ability to interact with animals, public and other exhibitors' neat and clean display and pen' observance of all rules and regulations, and cooperation.

PERFORMANCE CHAMPION AND RESERVE. This award is for animals who have shown in at least three of the following classes: Advanced Freestyle-Obstacle (required); Advanced Trail/Pack Llama; Advanced PR/Companion Llama; Pleasure Driving and Obstacle Driving. The llama meeting all the requirements and having the most points wins Performance Champion. Reserve Performance Champion is the animal with next highest amount of points. All ties will be broken by noting the animal placing highest in the Advanced Obstacle class.

YOUTH CHAMPION AND RESERVE YOUTH CHAMPION – CHAMPION AND RESERVE WILL BE DETERMINED BY THE BEST COMBINED SCORE FROM 3 CLASSES. Freestyle Obstacle and Companion PR will be required classes. The 3rd class may be Trail Pack or Showmanship. If a youth completes all 4 classes, the higher score will count. Scores will be tabulated using the ILR point chart on page 109 of the Guidelines. The youth with the greatest number of points in each division becomes the Senior, Intermediate or Junior Youth Champion.

VERSATILITY CHAMPION AND RESERVE. The award will be based on points earned in halter class and at least 2 performance classes (Advanced Freestyle-Obstacle, Advanced Trail/Pack, Advanced PR/Companion, Obstacle Driving and Pleasure Driving).
